A Broadway production is planned for next year. The play was hailed as 'an evening of polished malice', and applauded for its two 'fabulous parts' for older actresses.

His next was Storm in a Flower Vase, about the society florist Constance Spry, starring Penny Downie, and directed by Alan Strachan. The Times gave it a **** review calling it 'an attractive bouquet of fragrant art and pungent emotion.' He has just completed a book entitled Portraying Elizabeth, which includes interviews with Eileen Atkins, Glenda Jackson, Miranda Richardson and Harriet Walter.

His latest performed play, Mrs. Pat, was performed at Chichester Festival Theatre in 2015 and starred Penelope Keith, it was directed by Alan Strachan. Other work includes Lady Mosley's Suite, which was read in October 2010 at the Trafalgar Studios with a cast including Emilia Fox and Patricia Hodge. He is at work on his first contemporary piece entitled Year of the Virgin.
